Hawks, Owls and Falcons – Oh My!

Have you heard the hoot of an owl at night or seen a red tailed hawk soaring overhead? These are just two of the species of birds known as raptors that live in the New Glarus area and are frequently heard or seen from a distance but rarely close up. You will have the chance to see a variety of raptors close up, learn about their habits and have your questions answered at this program designed for the whole family.



This program will be held at the New Glarus High School Auditorium, 1701 Second Street, New Glarus, Wisconsin on Thursday, October 20 at 7:00 PM. The presentation will last about one hour with time available for questions following. Come learn about these fascinating birds and the role they play in our local eco-system.

Presenter Dianne Moller is a licensed rehabilitator and educator from Hoo's Woods Raptor Center in Milton, Wisconsin. Moller plans on bringing a falcon, hawk, and owl to her

presentation; she will share information about each bird including their habitat, nesting practices, eating habits, and migratory behavior.
