Bluebirding in Wisconsin-February 26, 2010

This workshop will be held at the New Glarus High School Commons located at 1701 Second Street, New Glarus, Wisconsin starting at 7:00 PM on Friday, February 26, 2010. The lecture will last approximately one hour with another thirty minutes available afterwards for questions, comments, and an opportunity to visit with other attendees.



Dr. Kent Hall is a Professor Emeritus of Biology at UW-Stevens Point. Hall retired from teaching in 1998, but remains more active than ever in the area of bird watching, especially as it relates to bluebird conservation, research and education. Many of his activities are associated with the Bluebird Restoration Association of Wisconsin (BRAW), for which he serves as a Vice-President and coordinates data collection on the number of bluebirds in the entire state.

This seminar will provide attendees with information about the bluebird species, their habits and many other facts about this interesting and much beloved bird species. Attendees will learn first-hand how to prepare for this spring's return of the bluebirds to southern Wisconsin.


